Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I really need to get approval for my project?

A: Most of the changes you make to the exterior of you house or you landscaping will require approval. You can check the architectural guidelines for minor exceptions, but the best way to proceed is to ask the ACC whether approval is required. Completing a project without prior approval can have serious consequences.

Q: Are there any resources I can utilize in planning my project?

A: The city of Louisville is an excellent source. They have information on decks, sun rooms, additions, basements, and irrigation, to name just a few. Call the Building Department to see what they have, stop by their office in city hall, or contact their web site at www.ci.louisville.co.us.

Q: How long will it take to get a response from the ACC?

A: The ACC always gives prompt attention to requests. Some may be approved in a few days, Others may take longer depending on the complexity, the need to gather additional background information, revisions required after the initial request, and other factors. To be sure your project is not delayed, you should submit a request at least two weeks prior to your starting date.
